When:

The District Advisory Council Meeting will occur on Thursday, March 21, 2019, at 6:00 p.m. at the Boathouse at Confluence Park, 679 West Spring Street, Columbus, OH 43215. It is a public meeting and interested parties are encouraged to attend.

Meetings & Duties:

The five-member Board of Health meets on the second Tuesday of every month at 9:30 a.m. at 280 East Broad Street, Columbus, OH 43215. Board Members are compensated \$70 per meeting. The Board of Health has fiduciary authority over the agency's \$10 million dollar budget, sets policy and rules regarding its programs and services, and also serves as the judicatory body for Franklin County Public Health. Board members provide strategic direction for the agency's work to fill the role of chief health strategist for our community's public health system.
