

Franklin County Overdose Data to Action: Limiting Overdose through Collaborative Actions in Localities Project (OD2A LOCAL)

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

Q: The eligibility criteria states that an organization must be a non-profit organization or a public organization, our agency is neither. Would that bar us from applying?

A: A revision has been made to page 3 in the RFA as follows:

C. Eligibility

The following criteria must be met for grant applications to be eligible for review:

- Applicants must be a local public, for-profit, and/or non-profit agency within Franklin County, Ohio.
- All current subrecipients funded in 2023-2024 are eligible to apply.
- Applicant does not owe funds to FCPH or CDC.
- Applicant has submitted application and all required attachment **by 5:00 p.m. on July 1, 2024.**

Q: Will this be a new agreement, or just an amendment to our current one?

A: This will be a new agreement for existing partners for the time period September 2024 to August 2025 for year 2 of the OD2A LOCAL grant.

Q: On page 11 of the RFA, it says that applicants have to submit a signed DUA. However, on the Qualtrics submission form, it just says to acknowledge that you reviewed the DUA template. Can you please clarify what is required for the DUA for submitting the application?

A: A signed DUA is not a required portion of the application process but would be required if the partner organization is tentatively awarded. All awards are tentative dependent on multiple factors including the submission of a signed DUA. For the purposes of the application, please review the DUA template attachment of the RFA and confirm your understanding of it in the Qualtrics form.

Q: Can you clarify the "level of funding?"

A: The section on page 13 of the RFA under Category C: Awarding explains how funds will be allocated to grant sub-awardees. Specifically, it details the funding limits for the three components: A, B, and C. Each component has its specified minimum and maximum amounts that a sub-awardee can receive.

C. Awarding

Component A:

Award Ceiling: \$290,000.00

Award Floor: \$25,000.00

Component B:

Award Ceiling: \$140,000.00

Award Floor: \$25,000.00

Component C:

Award Ceiling: \$170,000.00

Award Floor: \$25,000.00

Understanding these limits is crucial for applicants to appropriately tailor their proposals and budget requests to align with the available funding for each component.
